

The Best Pickleball/Tennis Overgrips

I have tried over 30 different overgrip brands and styles over the last 2 years, and I have learned a white color grip is the best option because many believe white overgrips retain their tackiness better due to less dye affecting the grip material. If the overgrip is colored, it may wear down quicker due to the dye. With a white overgrip, you can also see when the grip is visually dirty and when it needs to be changed with other grip colors; it may be harder to tell. The one I liked the most for pickleball was the **Joola Feel-Tec Premium Polyurethane synthetic overgrips**. This overgrip is perfect for a soft feel and a tacky surface. I'm a big fan of how Joola packages this grip in a roll of 4 grips, and it's easy to pull an overgrip from the roll. Most companies fold up their overgrips, and then it gets bent and stuffed down the abyss of a pickleball bag with a roll shape. It's easy to store and grab an overgrip quicker with the roll shape.



My favorite tennis overgrip setup is the **Tourna genuine leather grip** that helps with durability overwrapped with the **Yonex Super Grap Polyurethane overgrip**. Multiple-time Grand Slam winner Novak Djokovic uses leather grips on his tennis racquets. Yonex rules king in the tennis overgrip universe. The grip is soft and has a tacky surface and absorbs sweat incredibly well. I noticed this overgrip lasted a lot longer than the other dozens I've tried. By the way, both of these grips come in the roll shape.



Honorable Mention: [Tourna Grip XL](#) and [Tourna Grip Pickleball](#). The quantity you get of these overgrips for the price is incredible. Tourna grips are made out of silicone and other high-grade materials, and its iconic light blue color has been killing the game for years, and a ton of pros play with this grip, and most people like it because it gets tackier the sweatier you get to help keep a firm grip on the racquet. During the summer on hot days, this grip is the best to use for excessive sweat. The Grip also comes in the roll shape.
